Jack is hoping to follow in the tyre tracks of some recent Tigers mascots such as Mirfield's Great Britain star Josh Auty, who now rides for Birmingham in the Elite League, and, more recently, Nathan Greyes, who won both the 250cc and 500cc British Under-16s titles last year.

Jack will this year ride a specially built 180cc engine. His mascot duties will include leading out the team on a prematch parade after which he will do exhibition rides before and during all the home league meetings.

The aim is to also travel to as many away meetings as possible.

Last season he rode a tracks as far afield as Somerset and Glasgow.

Sheffield Tigers ride every Thursday from March to October and have some of the best facilities in the country - and one of the fastest circuits in the UK.
