The wet weather caused problems for the racers in heat two, Jack's first appearance of the day, and the Ossett youngster fell while leading but he quickly got back onto his bike and moved back up to third place before a

fall for leader Kenny Bowdry forced the race to be stopped.

However, the two precious points gave Jack a huge boost and he went on to rack-up another three race wins and the second fastest time of the meeting to qualify for the final, which lived up to all expectations.

Jack and unbeaten rider Henry Atkins were the favourites to lift the trophy while Kings Lynn rider Lewis Whitmore and Leicester's Ben Woodhull also lined up at the starting gates.

Atkins and his Ossett rival went wheel-to-wheel and traded the lead only for Jack to be edged into second at the finishing line.
